



Breeding Soundness Exams, Impacts Beyond Just the Bulls

We are excited to once again offer Breeding Soundness Exams (BSEs) for your herd bulls. BSEs should be completed 4-6 weeks prior to turning bulls out with your herd of cows. Even if a bull passed their BSE last year, annual exams are recommended as fertility can change from year to year. BSEs consist of a physical examination (including feet and legs), examination of semen under a microscope to ensure proper motility and morphology (sperm appearance), scrotal exam and measurement, palpation of reproductive glands, and body condition score. A fertile bull allows cows to be bred in an efficient manner, leading to a shorter calving window. The calves will wean at a more uniform weight across the group, which will pay off in the sale ring. A sub-fertile bull out with your herd can lead to a loss of 50-60 pounds of weaning weight per 21-day cycle, costing thousands on sale day. A fertile bull leads to more calves on the ground and less open cows. BSEs are conducted at the clinic.


